

DISCOVERING MACDONALD GILL: ARCHITECT, ARTIST AND MAPMAKER

The last lecture of the 2017-2018 Season - and our last before The Arts Society Fylde moves to the Lowther Pavilion Theatre in Lytham - looks at a remarkable but lesser-known artist: MacDonald 'Max' Gill (1884–1947), younger brother of the sculptor Eric Gill. He was an architect, letterer and graphic artist of the first half of the twentieth century, best known for his pictorial map posters for the London Underground and painted map panels for such iconic buildings as Lindisfarne Castle. His architectural legacy lives on in the arts and crafts cottages he designed in rural Sussex and Dorset while the alphabet he created for the standard military headstone is familiar to all.

Not for the first time at The Arts Society Fylde, we have the pleasure of welcoming a lecturer who has a family link to the afternoon's subject—Caroline Walker is Max Gill's great niece and she promises us a fully-illustrated talk that gives fascinating insights into the life and work of this talented artist.
